ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR THE INTERNET

Background: Internet access is now available to teachers and students in our school. The Internet is an electronic highway connecting thousands of computers all over the world. With access to computers and people all over the world also comes availability of material that may not be considered to be of educational value in the context of the school setting. Our school will try to take precautions deemed necessary to control access, but with the vast networks on the Internet is difficult to control the computer literate student from gaining access to controversial materials. It is our belief that the educational materials as well as the interaction with other world cultures makes exploring the Internet a valuable tool for the knowledge quest of our students.

Internet Guidelines: The use of the Internet is a privilege, not a right, and inappropriate use will result in a cancellation of those privileges. The school administrator and the faculty will deem what is inappropriate use and their decision is final.

Before access is granted each user must receive training on how to use the Internet correctly. Parents have the option of denying their child individual access to the Internet.

The following guidelines are provided so everyone is aware of the responsibilities that come with using the Internet. If a student violates and of the provisions, his or her access to the Internet use will be denied. The signatures on this document indicate that those who signed have read the terms and conditions carefully and understand their significance.

RULES FOR INTERNET USE:

1. Never share your password or account with anyone. You have full responsibility for the use of your password or account. You will be held responsible for any violations of these rules that can be traced to your account.
2. Do not vandalize computers, software, or network devices.
3. Obey the rules of copyright.
4. Do not download software without permission from your instructor.
5. Do not post personal communication in a public forum without the author's prior consent. All messages posted in a public forum such as a news group may be copied in a subsequent communications, so long as proper attribution is given.
